On Friday 25 September Stormont House had its first "Stop The Clock" event this year, the aim was to celebrate living in London.

We were visited by Mrs Jackie Murphy who is the Pearly Queen of Hackney, who visited school in full costume to talk to the students about the history of the Pearly Kings and Queens. Mrs Murphy married into the Hitchen family whose ancestors were first crowned as Pearly Kings and Queens in 1894, she was chair of The Original Pearly Kings and Queen Association until recently, ensuring the London tradition is kept going by younger generations.



Mrs Murphy has raised thousands of pounds for charities by performing, singing and representing Pearlies at key events including the London 2012 Opening Ceremony.

Mrs Murphy spoke about cockney rhyming slang and gave the students a few examples:

apples and pears = stairs
dog and bone = phone
barnet fair = hair

After the talk by Mrs Murphy the students were able to enjoy a traditional London Fete, where they took part in a variety of activities: tug of war, welly wanging, bean bag throwing, splat a rat, treasure hunt, beat the goalie, play your cards right and curling.
