On Monday 19 May Year 9 set off for the outward bound adventure to Edale Youth Hostel in the Peak District. Although the journey of 181 miles took just over 4 hours the pupils were very well behaved, when they arrived at the centre they trekked up the main road to the centre surrounded by sheep, cows and an array of other farm animals. Once the luggage was stowed in their rooms and the introductions had been made the pupils started their first activity 'Icebreakers' which included some very serious welly throwing, ball skills and team building games.

The other activities the pupils took part in were canoeing, Weaseling (which is squeezing through holes in rocks on the hills in the Peak District, High Ropes and caving.
