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Learning through Landscapes Project





7MU have been taking part in a nature connection project funded by national charity **Learning through Landscapes.**

My School, My Planet was designed to engage young people in learning from nature and give them practical insight into how nature works and how we can connect with it.

The class has done amazing things, including preparing the large bed and planting a herb garden which everyone has been enjoying. They also got creative with natural materials, using tools to make conker necklaces, and learning about how herbs can keep us calm by making lavender bags as gifts.

7MU have also been exploring Hackney Downs, learning more about trees through sensory activities, making mini habitats and going on mini beast hunts, where they found stag beetle larvae! They were enormous; and one student said they felt "oily."







As a final celebration of the project, the students rolled beeswax candles and used the new apple press with the help of chef Charlie, connecting the work of bees to the food we eat. It has been an exciting and memorable journey!"







Update from the Speech and Language Team

'6 Point Scale'

Students have been making their own personal '6 Point Scale' during Expressive Arts. These scales can sit on their desks and allow for lots of opportunities to check-in with their emotions throughout the school day.



The SALT team are introducing class toolkits into each classroom this term. The toolkits will be used to model and support students to regulate their emotions and get back to a 1. For example, if they are feeling a 3 on the scale, they might be unsettled, we can model a strategy from the toolkit to get back to 1- they could do some 'lazy 8' breathing or squeeze a sensory ball. The Speech and Language Team will be training staff on how to use the toolkits in the classroom in November.
