Lily, Year 9, competed against the top ranked British women in what was her first senior competition winning all of her matches convincingly at the Tennis Foundation's National championships for learning difficulties in Nottingham.

Lily has enjoyed playing tennis since she was four years old and takes to the court at Islington Tennis Centre up to four times a week. Even after suffering a serious ankle injury she continued to train in a wheelchair.

Her mother, Ms Bayley, said: "She beat some of the girls that represent the national team so it's a really great achievement. Lily started playing when she was four, I used to drag her to watch her brother and we would hit a ball around together." Lily's dream is to meet and play tennis with her idol Rafael Nadal.


