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## October is AAC Awareness month!

Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) is a set of different tools and strategies that individuals use to support their communication. These tools and strategies come under 3 categories:

**No tech** - communication does not involve any additional equipment such as; body language, gestures, pointing, eye pointing, facial expressions, vocalisations, signing.

**Low-tech communication systems** do not need a battery to function such as; pen and paper to write messages or draw, communication charts, exchange systems or core vocabulary boards.

**High-tech communication systems** need power from a battery or mains.

They range from:

- Buttons that speak a recorded message when pressed
- Apps which are on mobile devices, tablets and iPads which allow a person to fully communicate their wants, needs and ideas!

AAC Awareness month is a chance to highlight and celebrate the different ways that people communicate. The theme for this year is '**Say what? Sharing your most memorable moments with AAC**' and was chosen because so many times in life, things don't go to plan or unexpected things happen.

At Stormont House School, the students use a range of communication tools and strategies to express their wants, needs and ideas every day. The Speech and Language Therapy team continue to support staff and students to create an accessible and inclusive community when it comes to communication.
