BSF News Building Schools for the Future Update

As you know, BSF public consultation evenings were held on 18 & 20 January regarding the authority's proposal to relocate the school site further back from the road onto the current defunct Bowling Green site. There were not many responses, but some local residents were strongly against the idea of moving the building further into the park. The school is very sympathetic to this point of view, and our preference all along has been for the new school to be next to Downs Park Road.

What happens now?

The good news is that the authority is making plans for the new school to be exactly where we are now. However, this means that we would move out of our current school in summer 2012 and return to the new school around the end of 2013. In the meantime we would be at the school site on Mount Pleasant Lane, E5. Some of you may know this as the former Skinners' Lower School, and others may know that Our Lady's Convent High School are currently there while their new school is being built.

Will it actually happen?

We certainly hope so, as the government says that the Hackney plans are unaffected by the cuts. In the meantime, there is still a lot of work to be dozen in agreeing the overall shape and design of the building. It has to suit the needs of the pupils now and into the future, and also be able to pass through the planning process, so there is a lot of work going on to achieve this. As soon as an overall draft design is agreed, we will involve all parents and carers in discussion. Your parent governors will have an important role to play, as the plans will need to be agreed by governors.
