Well Done to Everyone who reached their targets each week to enable them to go on these outings.



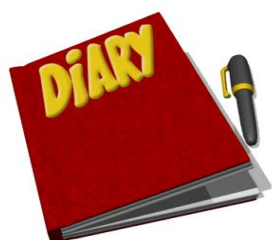
