The pupils were able to measure the depth, width and speed of the water.



Year 7 at The Science Museum

On Monday 28 March Year 7 went to the Science Museum in South Kensington with Mr Ahmed, Ms Whitbread, Ms Knight and Ms Cohen. The group travelled by overground train to Liverpool Street Station and then got on the tube to South Kensington. The pupils were split up into four groups to look around the museum's exhibits based on the world's energy resources.
