There are currently three vacancies on the governing body for Parent Governors. Any parent that has a child on the register of this school may stand as a candidate by completing a nomination form and returning it to the school by the date shown. You may nominate yourself or you may nominate any other parent **with their permission**.

Governors play an important role in supporting the school and in making decisions about the service provided for your children. For example, they are responsible for:

- helping to establish the aims and policies of the school and how the standards of education can be improved
- helping to draw up the school development plan
- helping to decide how to spend the school's budget
- selecting the Headteacher/Deputy Headteacher
- linking the local community with the school
- the appointment, promotion, support and discipline of staff
- drawing up an action plan after an OFSTED inspection and monitoring how it is put into practice

Stormont House School Council - Democratic Week An Interview with Michael Jones Hackney Counsellor - New River Ward

On Friday 25 October representatives from the Stormont House School Council met with Michael Jones who is a Counsellor for Hackney - New River Ward. Michael is concerned with the following areas -

- Council (next meeting: Oct 30 2013, 7.00PM)

The School Council members had worked together with Mrs Napier to formulate a number of questions to find out what it was like to be a counsellor and to ask Michael if he had any suggestions about how to be a more productive School Council.

Michael is one of the youngest counsellors in the country, he has been a counsellor for four years, and his term of office is up next May. He will have to canvass to become a counsellor in the next Hackney Council elections which take place in 2014. Michael is changing ward for next year he will be canvassing in the Springfield Ward.

Michael was a keen member of his own School Council when he was a pupil at Homerton Boys School he went on to be a member of Hackney Youth Parliament before taking up his position on the council.

Nikita asked Michael: "How do you prepare yourself for meetings and speaking in public? Can you give us any tips for how we could prepare for speaking to our classmates?"

Michael responded by saying - "I always make sure that I have researched the topic I am meant to be discussing - so that I can handle any questions that are asked. I think one of the best ways to prepare to speak in front of any audience is to be fully prepared."
