Pay attention to the teachers as they explain the lesson.



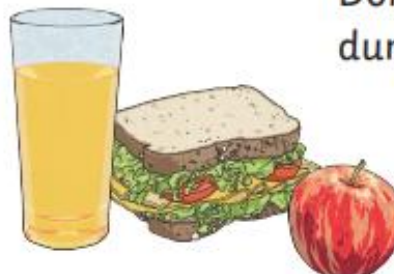
Only unmute yourself if the teacher has asked you to ask or answer a question.
