What does the job involve?

Ensuring students achieve as highly as possible in order to progress to further study, find employment and self-expression as active citizens in an ever-changing future. Developing staff skills in teaching & learning to provide the best possible curriculum, outcomes and progression for all students.

What will I be directly responsible for?

- Leading, managing and developing the teaching of Art & Design in the school, ensuring the best possible progress and outcomes for every individual group.
- Having an impact on the educational progress of students other than your assigned classes or groups
 of students by overseeing a department of two teachers of art, and one part-time technician;
 monitoring and supporting the planning, delivery and assessment of Art & Design from KS3 to KS5,
 including all accreditation in KS4.
- Teaching: approximately 15 lessons over three days (currently)
- Being a form tutor (approx. 11 students) and taking a lead role ensuring each has positive outcomes in their learning and personal development

Who are you?

- 2. A first-class teacher and leader, experienced in leading improvement and learning from mistakes
- 3. We don't wish to limit applicants to secondary/FE experience only but you would be expected to either have/be willing to develop very quickly an understanding of the accreditation at KS4 (GCSE, UAL award)
- 4. Committed to keeping children safe through teaching them to identify and manage risk
- 5. A self-starting team player with much to offer while still ready to learn
- 6. Ready to make the most of this opportunity to further improve teaching, learning and assessment in our school

Who are the students?

Our students

- 1. Are fantastic, though not an 'easy ride' in any sense
- 2. Have usually been in mainstream primary school before coming here at secondary transfer and have a wide range of Learning, Speech, Language & Communication and Emotional Needs. Some transfer after a difficult time in secondary.
- 3. Usually remain here until age 16 or 17 before going onto local colleges or other providers
- 4. Have many strengths and talents as well as difficulties, achieving up to GCSE/BTEC levels at age 16 with some progressing over time to level 2, 3 or higher qualifications
- 5. Make great strides with their personal, social and academic development during their time here

What else do you need to know?

- We are a lead school in the Hackney Teaching School Alliance where we work alongside 11 primaries, 3 secondary, a nursery and alternative provision. Developing our impact on teacher training and CPD beyond our school is a priority for the coming year.
- We are a National Support School and support development of educational leadership, teaching & learning as far away as Suffolk.
- We have made the John Hattie Visible Learning Plus Programme a central part of our CPD programme, developing evidence-informed approaches to teaching and learning
- We have a new 3-storey building that we helped design; exciting!
- Most of our staff come from mainstream, but we welcome applications from special, FE or AP settings
- Although they make great strides with their personal, social and academic development here, most students will still have considerable difficulties with their learning when they are in KS4.
- Salary is competitive: TLR2a plus SEN1 on the Inner London Scale. Possibilities for additional responsibilities and salary progression may arise once in role. These can be discussed at interview.
- We take safeguarding children seriously: employment is not confirmed until a reference from your current/most recent Headteacher and enhanced clearance from the Disclosure and Barring Scheme (DBS) are received.
