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Free School Meals – We can help Make sure you claim!

As you know all pupils at Stormont House have a school dinner. Dinner money is £1.70 per day or £8.50 per week. Dinner money is payable on a Monday morning at reception. Please clearly mark your child's name on an envelope with the correct money if possible inside.

You can apply for free school meals if you receive one the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and your income is £16,190 or less (this figure changes each April).
- Working Tax Credit for four weeks after your employment finishes
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Support from the National Asylum Support Service (NASS)

If you receive any of the above and are not currently claiming free school meals please speak to Monica (Receptionist) who will be able to provide an application form and help you to complete it. Alternatively you can download a form from <u>www.learningtrust.co.uk</u> or pick one up from The Learning Trust offices at 1 Reading Lane, E8 1GQ.

How much money could I save?

If your child is entitled to free school meals, you could save on average £10 per week or £390 per year. If you complete a free schools meal application the school will also benefit by receiving additional funding. Please let us know if you need any assistance with your application.

If you are entitled to free school meals but do not apply, you must pay for school meals.
