9H English Black History Project

Following their studies of Black History Month in English, some of year 9 pupils have been writing letters home from a slave's point of view. Here are examples of some of the emotional work they produced:

"It's terrible. They've locked us with shackles. I'm so hungry but I can't eat because the white people are giving us more work and we're getting whipped by the English people. Some people tried and got away so they can get some help. We never take a shower or a bath. Living in a cabin is so terible. It smells and there is no bed, it's cold and we're all cramped together."

Moses

"We arrived in Jamaica on a hot morning. I felt like I was there for days; I could hear people and children vomiting and crying. There were white strange people shouting and whipping people. I felt like I was in despair; I couldn't understand anything they were saying."

Tia

"I was in a merchant ship and it was dark, cold and terrifying; I weed myself. Before very long I was very hungry. Above me, I could hear black people getting whipped."

Michael

"We've just arrived in Jamaica and it is very hot here. I'm sweating a lot. They don't treat us well here. They whip us and we can't eat much. My feet hurt because we've been walking far. I'm worried about when it's my turn to get whipped."

Jack

"The arrival was bad because the European people were beating us just to get off the boat. They put us in shackles and we were shown around the village. Then we started planting sugar cane in warm weather".

Timothy

"Being on the ship was the worst thing in everybody's life. Mums were taken and dads have been put to work and all the children have been starved to death."
