School Life Art Therapy Service

ASpace for Support is an art therapy service currently operating at Stormont House. Two art therapists come into school on Monday and Tuesday each week to work with pupils who have been referred to them by teaching staff. Art therapy is used as a way to express feelings on paper and in different media, for example sand, clay, or water. The therapy is not about learning more about art or being good at art, it is about discovering things about feelings and relationships. Working with a therapist allows pupils to talk through emotions and about relationships in a setting that is not a lesson or counselling session. Pupils who go to art therapy generally find it very enjoyable and helpful. If your child is referred for art therapy you will be sent a letter asking for your agreement before they attend any sessions.

Stormont House School Council
